



MEDIA

Section Media Passes WILL BE ACCEPTED at all rounds. Please use your Section issued media credential for entry into all games you wish to attend (Sample on pg. 8).

Note: *No CIF Section, faculty or student passes will be honored at the gate for admission (Section issued MEDIA passes are the ONLY exception).

CHAMPIONSHIP FIELD

There will be five (5) events at the CIF Regional Badminton Championships. A player may only be entered in one event. The five (5) events are as follows:

- a) Girls' singles
- b) Boys' singles
- c) Girls' doubles
- d) Boys' doubles
- e) Mixed doubles

COACHES BADGES/COURT ACCESS

For teams with 1-3 participants, one (1) coach will be granted admission and a badge for access to the playing area. For teams with 4-7 participants, two (2) coaches will be granted admission and a badge for access to the playing area. For teams with 8+ participants, three (3) coaches will be granted admission and a badge for access to the playing area. All additional coaches/team staff beyond your team allotment must pay admission to enter the gymnasium, and are not allowed access to the playing area.

COACHES MEETING

Coaches Meeting: 8:00am.

Bylaw 503.E.:

No CIF team (or individual) shall participate in interscholastic or approved competition with any other team unless the CIF team is under supervision as required by the California Education Code 49032.

Bylaw 503.F.:

All coaches of CIF member school teams must meet the requirements of the California Education Code 49032, 35179.1 and Bylaw 22.B.9.

Further, it is important to note all coaches must remain on site throughout the competition.

TOURNAMENT ENTRIES

A player may be entered in one event only. The following formula will be used to determine entries into the CIF Regional Badminton Championships. Section Tournament Directors must submit entries to the CIF Regional Badminton Tournament Director by Monday, May 15 at noon.

SUBSTITUTIONS

Scratch meeting – a representative from each school must attend the scratch meeting, otherwise their athletes are scratched. No alternate will be added after 9:00am. If you default a match you are out of the tournament. Alternates will not be allowed to play unless they are listed on the entry form submitted by the section. A player may not be listed as an alternate if he/she is listed as an entrant in another event.

STARTING TIMES/PAIRINGS

Competition begins at 9:00 am

DEVELOPMENT OF BRACKETS

Development of brackets will be constructed as follows:

- a) Boys singles
- b) Girls singles
- c) Boys doubles
- d) Girls doubles
- e) Mixed doubles

Brackets will be developed according to the following procedures:

- a) First and second place qualifiers from the same section will be placed in opposite halves by draw.
- b) Quarter brackets will separate the top four qualifiers from each section.
- c) Players from the same section will not face each other in round 1.

UNIFORMS

Participants must comply with the following uniform requirements:

a) All mixed doubles teams must wear shirts and shorts of the same color and trim pattern, but do not have to be identical. A single partial/whole manufacturer's logo/trademark (no more than 2 ¼ inches) and/or one American Flag is permitted on the shirt. The shirts and shorts do not have to be manufactured by the same company. Participants must wear their team uniform for the duration of the championship event. Failure to abide by these guidelines may result in disqualification for matches. The Tournament Director will have the final say on all uniform questions and enforcement.

SCORERS

Each school that wins a match will be responsible for providing one scorer for the following match on that court unless an umpire is assigned.

RULEBOOK

The USA Badminton Rule Book is the governing authority used at the CIF Regional Badminton Championships.

TOURNAMENT FORMAT

The championship bracket in each of the five (5) events will be a double elimination tournament.

- Everyone starts in the Winner's Bracket.
- If you lose in the 1st or 2nd round match, you will be placed in the Consolation Bracket.
- If you make it to the Semi-finals in the Winner's Bracket, you are guaranteed to do no worse than 4th.
- Medals will be given to 1st-4th in the Winner's Bracket, and the Consolation Winner.
- All matches, Winner's and Consolation games are best 2 out of 3 sets to 21.

AWARDS

Awards will be presented from First through Fourth place winners in singles and doubles events. There are no team awards or team points calculated at this event.

RE: EXPECTATIONS FOR SCHOOLS, COACHES AND STUDENT-ATHLETES IN PURSUING VICTORY WITH HONOR_{sm}

The CIF was formed, and had its humble beginning, during the 1914-1915 school year with only 65,927 high school students in California; it has been estimated that less than 8,000 students were participating on their high school athletic teams. Today, California high schools boast over 1.8 million students and this past school year over 830,000 students participated in education-based athletics in California.

During the past century, education-based athletics transformed from an important local community event to one that is frequently on broadcast television and the Internet with full-time websites dedicated to recruiting and blogging about teams, student-athletes and coaches. Most however, still refer to education-based athletics as the last “true amateur sport” venue in America, because our mission and value system is based upon the core foundation of student participation, sportsmanship and fair play. While professional sports, collegiate athletics and even most youth programs have moved toward a business model where finances, income and winning is the sole mission, high school sports still remains dedicated to providing opportunities for kids to compete in a safe and fair environment.

Sports add richness to a school culture by providing opportunities for any student who wants them. It is the largest “elective” program on any high school campus. Nationally, and here in California, participation by students in high school sports programs is at its highest level in history proving the desire and need is vast. In the process of deriving enjoyment from participation in athletics (Number one reason kids play sports: Fun), our students are learning life-long skills that help them develop into healthy adults and productive citizens. National research continues to validate that students involved in extra-curricular activities attend more days of school, perform better in the classroom, and have less behavioral issues at school; lower dropout rates and lower alcohol and drug abuse rates, than students who do not participate. The data and the lists of participation benefits are endless.

It is true that we occasionally see acts of poor sportsmanship and behavior by a player or a coach, but the overwhelming majority of school contests reflect the positive elements of Pursuing Victory with Honor_{sm}. True, the goal is always to win the contest, but high school sports, when done correctly, places the value of life lessons, character and sportsmanship ahead of winning. It is this ability of education-based sports leaders to keep athletics in its proper perspective that helps separate us from the rest.

It is vital that as parents, fans and education-based sports leaders that we remember that less than 2% of our participating students will go on and compete in college athletics. Kids participate in sports because it’s fun and the athletic fields and gymnasium classrooms our schools provide gives adults the opportunity to teach valuable lessons that might not be learned in any other environment. Creating life-long skills and helping create better citizens through participation in education-based athletics is the greatest gift we can give to the future.






