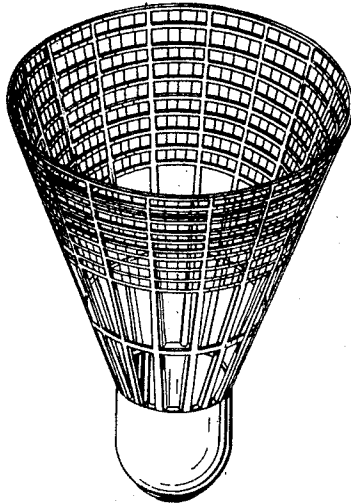

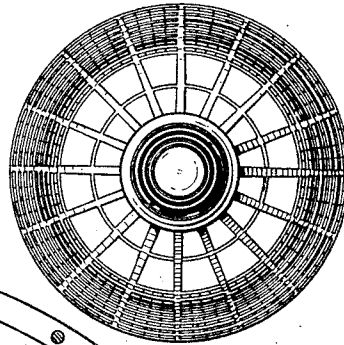

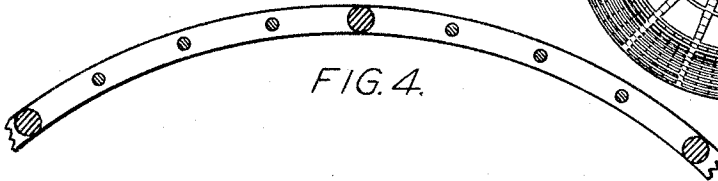
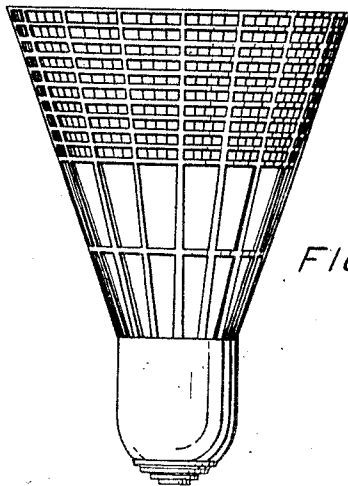

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, William Charles Carlton, a subject of the King of England, residing at "Oaklands," 14 Herbert Road, Hornchurch, in the county of Essex, in the Realm of England, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Shuttlecock, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is an isometric view of a shuttlecock showing my new design;

Figure 2 is a side elevation of the new design;

Figure 3 is a plan view of the new design; and

Figure 4 is an enlarged fragmentary horizontal section through the upper portion of the shuttlecock as shown in Figure 2.
